**Lange & Söhne** This Cabaret boasts a patented novelty – the first tourbillon escapement that can be stopped for setting the time to the second. Manually wound movement with twin barrels for a five-day power reserve. Large date with integrated setting pushpiece, power-reserve indicator. Pink-gold case, sapphire-crystal caseback. CHF 269,600

**Maitres du Temps** The Chapter One chronograph has been developed by Christophe Claret, Roger Dubuis and Peter Speake-Marin. Manually wound tourbillon movement, retrograde timezone at 9 o'clock, retrograde dates at 3 o'clock and 60-minute counter at 12. Days indicated on a roller at 6 o'clock. Moon phases on a roller at 12 o'clock. 62.6 x 45.9 mm gold case, sapphire-crystal caseback. CHF 400,000 excl. tax



**Omega** The Olympic Timeless model recalls the chronographs Omega used to time the 1932 Los Angeles Olympics. COSC-certified, selfwinding movement with coaxial escapement. Five subdials as Olympic rings displaying small seconds, 7-day chronograph counter, days, 12-hour and 30-minute counters. Date at 6 o'clock. 44.25 mm steel case with sapphire-crystal caseback. Water resistant to 100 m. CHF 7,300
