The first luxury watch collection by Maitres du Temps is a collaboration between world-renowned watchmakers Christophe Claret, Roger Dubuis, and Peter Speake-Marin. The Chapter One model features the world's first mechanical movement consisting of a tourbillon, a mono-pusher chronograph, retrograde date, retrograde GMT, and phase of the moon and day of the week indications displayed on their own distinctive rolling bars. H. Moser & Cie Mayu

A relatively new name in Swiss watches, H. Moser & Cie actually dates back to 1828 when Heinrich Moser left Schaffhausen, Switzerland, for Tsarist Russia, establishing his watch company in St. Petersburg. Gevril Avenue of Americas Serenade (white 18k gold)

Gevril is a 250-year-old luxury watch company that continues to think ahead. A case in point is the new Avenue of Americas Serenade Collection, limited-edition watches with a retro-inspired look that Gevril president Samuel Friedman believes "makes a bold statement for the wearer."
